NEWS FROM THE BOOSTERS/ATHLETIC DEPARTMENT

5th - 8th Grade Sports Requirements

To help you prepare for sports next year, if your child will be in 5th-8th grades next school year and will play sports for Holy Spirit, please read the following requirements for participation in sports.

PHYSICALS – Before a child can practice or participate in sports, they MUST have a physical on file each year with the school and Athletic Director. This physical must be dated no earlier than April 15th to cover the upcoming school year or one year to cover the sports being played. **YOU MUST SCHEDULE YOUR CHILD'S PHYSICAL with your physician or health care provider.**

Fall sports practices will begin for football, girls' volleyball and boys' soccer the Monday of the week of August 13th. You must have your child's physical completed by that date and turned in to the school and Athletic Director. They can be turned in the first night of signups and practice.

SPORTS PARTICIPATION FEE – There is a sports participation fee each year for those whose children will be playing sports. **The fee is \$85 for Holy Spirit Students.** The fee for non-school parishioner children wishing to play on Holy Spirit teams is \$135. These fees were approved by the Board of Directors of Holy Spirit School. This fee is per child/per year to a maximum of 2 fees per family. You can drop off the fee and physical at the school office to the attention of Athletic Director.

Thank you and have a great summer. We look forward to your participation in our athletic program and Boosters organization this coming school year and years to come.

4th Grade Parents Interested in Coaching and Fall Sports Coaches

If you are new to the sports program at Holy Spirit, you may not know that one of the most important parts of the program is YOU. Coaches for our sports teams come from the parents of our children 99% of the time. What a great way to be involved with your children and to meet other parents and become involved in the Boosters and sports program here at Holy Spirit.

If you would like to coach next school year (starting in mid-August) all you have to do is pick up an application in the school office or on the school website and return it to the office. You will also have to attend a Virtus training session, "Protecting God's Children".

If you wish to coach a fall sport (football, girls' volleyball or boys' soccer) please return an application by June 15th so the Athletic Committee of the Education Commission can review and approve your application so we can be ready when practices begin in August in the above sports.

If you wish to coach another sport during the school year, watch the school newsletter for announcements asking for coaches in the other sports of basketball, baseball, softball, girls' soccer and track or cheerleading.







Make anger work

Teach children that it isn't healthy to pretend we're not angry when we are. Instead of giving in to anger, though, find a solution to the problem. "In your anger do not sin" (Psalm 4:4).

Biblical advice for kids

Have a holy summer

Sing a psalm. Choose a psalm that praises God for his mercy, kindness, and love, such as Psalm 103. Learn a new line each week and sing or recite it together at dinner time or bed time. By summer's end, you will have learned a new way to praise God.

Strengthen a virtue. Virtues are good habits. For example, temperance can be practiced by limiting the amount of time spent watching television or using electronics. Charity can be

strengthened by volunteering for a local aid organization as a family.

Read a story. The Bible is a library of books that weave together the story of our family of faith.



Why do Catholics get confirmed?

The sacrament of Confirmation completes Baptism. In Confirmation, the recipient receives an outpouring of the Holy Spirit and an increase of spiritual gifts. He or she is spiritually equipped and called to be a public witness to



Christ in both words and deeds (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #1303). Confirmation can only be received once. Confirmation recalls Pentecost, when the Spirit was poured out on Jesus' disciples in the Upper Room and strengthened them to preach the Gospel (Acts 2:1-4).

Help children love Confession

All children need reassurance that they are loved even when they make mistakes. That's why Jesus created the Sacrament of Reconciliation. He wanted to give us an outward sign of his unconditional love and forgiveness. Try these tips to help children appreciate God's special, forgiving love:

"Who, Me?!" Children often think of sin as relative. "It was okay to hit her because she hit me first." "I took his pen because he took my glove." Children need to know that God's rules are the ones to follow. Use the Ten Commandments and the Beatitudes as guides.

"Say you're sorry." Even young children can understand the need to say they're sorry when they do something wrong. That's the first step toward taking responsibility for our actions and changing our behavior.

June 3 - Corpus Christi Sunday (1264). On this feast, we celebrate the transformation of the bread and wine into Jesus' Body and Blood in the Holy Eucharist, St. Juliana of Belgium had a vision of the full moon, representing the Church, with a dark spot in it, representing the missing solemnity. In 1264, Pope Urban IV ordered a Church-wide celebration for Corpus Christi, and asked St. Thomas Aguinas to compose the Office for the feast.

June 8 - St. William of York (1154). Born into a noble family in England,

St. William was named archbishop of York, but was slandered by political opponents. Despite this, St. William was never bitter or resentful. He died about two months after his consecration. probably poisoned.

June 16 – St. John-Francis Regis (1640). Born in France to a rich merchant, St. John-Francis joined the Jesuits when he was eighteen. Once ordained a priest, he was sent to southern France to start missions. He convinced his hearers to follow Christ more faithfully.
