Holy Spirit Child Development Center: Summer Care Program 2019: Enrollment Information

It is that time of year again to be thinking about summer child care. The CDC staff members are very excited for our 2019 Summer Care Program. Summer Care will begin on Monday, June 10th and will end on Wednesday, August 14th. The Summer Care Program is available for Holy Spirit school children, and pending availability, other children attending Catholic Schools within the Grand Rapids Catholic Diocese. Children must be fully enrolled, including full enrollment on Smart Tuition, at Holy Spirit for the 2019-20 school year for Preschool (3 years of age and toilet-trained) through 8th grade. The center hours are 7:00 am until 6:00 pm Monday through Friday (closed Thursday, July 4 & Friday, July 5). Each day will be filled with special activities for all the children. There are also weekly destination field trip opportunities for children using child care that will be entering 1st through 8th grade in the fall.

FESTIVAL ANNOUNCEMENT FROM THE PARISH

After an event as we celebrate the success, we also take the time for evaluation. What did we do that was great? What could use improvement? Is there anything we want to change moving forward? This year as Parish and Festival leadership discussed Festival we thought it might be time for a change. For that reason, there will be no Festival in the fall of 2019. Our parish festival will return in the spring of 2020, scheduled around our Parish celebration of Pentecost.

While there are several reasons we decided this was the best time to make a change here are a few that stood out:

- With the Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) and Diocesan Capital Campaign both happening this spring the parish took a look at how we could shift our priorities a bit. Alongside the other items it made sense that this be something we shift.
- The fall is a busy time of year! While we can make the argument that every time of year is busy, the time around which Festival is normally held is especially busy. Moving Festival will hopefully alleviate pulling people in a bunch of different directions, especially our hardworking volunteers!
- Finally, and perhaps the most important, sometimes events that have been around for many years just need a refresh. While Festival has been going on for many years and is a long-standing tradition at Holy Spirit, the people of our parish and our needs have changed over the years. The Educational Foundation auction did this a few years back and it really changed the face of the event and the impact on our community in a positive way. We are really hoping to reinvigorate Festival in this way too!

We know how much you love the cash raffle! We know you will miss it this fall, but we promise it will be back next spring. We are just giving you extra time to save some pennies and purchase an extra ticket!

For those organizations that have benefitted from the proceeds of Festival through volunteer hours, we will be following up with you to discuss a plan moving forward.

Finally, we want to be sure we mention Movie Night. Movie Night was added to Festival weekend last fall and despite the mosquitoes was a great night for families to come together in community and enjoy a movie outdoors. Movie Night will be something that continues on its own, separate from Festival. We are hoping to do three movie nights each year, one in the spring, summer and fall. Stay tuned for more details on this!

"Her children rise up and call her blessed; her husband, too, praises her: "Many are the women of proven worth, but you have excelled them all" (Proverbs 31:28-29).



Mary gives us her Mother's heart

In the month of May, we honor Mary who was dedicated to bringing the

Savior to humanity. Now that she is in Heaven, she continues to bring our concerns to her Son.
Praying the "Hail Mary" honors our Heavenly Mother as our mother, too.

Hail Mary, full of grace. Conceived without Original Sin, Mary was predisposed to holiness. Grace helped her to live a difficult life sinless.

The Lord is with thee. \\Blessed are thou among women: Mary was honored to be chosen as Jesus' mother.

Blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Mary knew that her Son was divine but she also knew what the prophets wrote about how he would suffer and die. As his mother, she

shared his joys and his suffering.

Holy Mary, Mother of God. Mary loved her child even more than the rest of us because he was her Lord and Savior, too.

Cross, Mary's job of

Now and at the hour of death. On Earth, Mary brought her Son to us. Now she brings us to the heart of her Son. She prays for us always because that's what a

mother does. Amen.



Why do Catholics call Mary "the Mother of the Church"?

Before he died, Jesus gave us his mother to be our mother. Looking down from the cross, Jesus saw Mary and St. John, and said, "Woman, behold, your son..." and to John, "Behold your mother" (John 19:26-27). Mary's motherhood for us is

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spiritual, yet very real. From the birth of the Church at Pentecost until her Assumption into Heaven, Mary nurtured and accompanied the early Church. She continues to support us today from her place in Heaven by her prayers.

Build up your child's conscience

Temptations come at our children from all directions. A strong conscience is a surefire way to help fight temptation. Here are some suggestions:

Obedience before understanding. Expect youngsters to do what is right at as young an age as possible, instead of waiting until they can understand why. Then good behavior is a habit that will be hard to break.

Right and wrong are not negotiable. Peers can devise clever arguments to justify sinful behavior, but right and wrong are absolutes. As Catholics we know

that "right" is anything God has told us to do, and we have Scripture, the Catechism, and other reliable sources from which to draw. Anything counter to this is wrong.

Repent and repair. If a child does something wrong, he needs to make amends. This means to ask forgiveness of the person hurt, repair the damage, and make things right with God

through Confession. When wronged, he must forgive and move on.

Demonstrate love. When youngsters feel loved, they are more receptive to our guidance.



John 14:23-29, "I will come back to you."

This Gospel reading comes from Jesus' Farewell Speech at the Last Supper.

After spending three years together, he had to prepare the close-knit group for his departure. He was going to suffer, die, and rise again. After that night, everything would be different: they would not see him in the same way again.

Yet he promised he would not leave them orphans. He wouldn't abandon them. He assured them that he would remain with them if they loved him and kept his word. Jesus would send the Holy Spirit to guide, comfort,


teach, and remind them of all he had taught them. Lastly, he promised them —and us—that he would return.

him whenever they want. He loves them always and is never too busy or too far away to help them.





May 1 - St. Joseph the Worker (1st century). Entrusted with the care of the Blessed Mother and Jesus, Joseph was a humble carpenter who was dedicated to his family and obedient to God.

May 14 - St. Maria Dominic Mazzarello (1881). Born near Genoa, Italy, she and a friend worked as dressmakers and started a boarding school for girls. Inspired by a vision, she worked with St. John Bosco to found the Salesian Sisters, and became its mother superior. She founded several houses in Italy and France.

May 21 - St. Christopher Magallanes and Companions (1937). Fr. Christopher Magallanes was part of the Catholic Action Movement in Mexico, resisting the anti-Catholic Mexican government. Despite great persecution, he established a seminary at Totatiche. Eventually, he was arrested, tortured, and martyred.

May 30 - Ascension of the Lord (1st century). This solemnity marks the completion of Jesus' mission of salvation and his triumphant entry into Heaven. Note: In many dioceses, observance of Ascension has been moved to the following Sunday.



May Crowning has always been one of my favorite parish events and I look forward to it every year. Last year, we



were out of town and missed it for the first time in years. To make me feel better, my girls

decided to do our own May Crowning in our backyard.

First, they brought out the largest statue of Mary we have. We placed her in our garden and planted some colorful flowers around her to surround her with color.

After doing some research, they put together a service, complete with programs. We sang some of our favorite Marian hymns, like Ave Maria, and Hail Holy Queen Enthroned Above. After reciting the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we placed a crown of flowers on the statue's head and recited the Rosary.

While it was no substitute for the parish celebration, I loved honoring our Mother in this special way.
