As our weather turns "wintery" ~ please help your child/ren remember to bring boots to school for outdoor recess. Students who wear boots may play on the blacktop area...otherwise students without boots will remain on the sidewalk so that the salt, slush, etc...is not tracked onto the carpet in the classrooms. Students who are fully dressed for winter (i.e. – snow pants, boots, hats, gloves, etc.) may choose to play on the playground equipment, the upper/lower fields, and/or go sledding when offered.

ILLNESS

If a child is ill, he/she should remain at home. The Health Department suggests that a child who is well enough to be in school is well enough to participate in all school activities, including outdoor recess and physical education. If a child is ill and remains at home during the school day, the student may not attend extra-curricular activities on that day (Education Commission Policy #6146.2.)

If a child becomes ill during the school day, a parent, relative, or a person designated on the child's enrollment form will be notified to come and get him/her.

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What follows is a summary of the Health Department publication entitled, "When to Keep Your Child Home." The school also uses these guidelines to determine if a child should be sent home from school as well.

FEVER	Do not allow child to return to school until fever-free for 24 hours. (unassisted-without medication)
COLD, COUGH	"Heavy cough" and hacking coughkeep home in bed even though no fever.
SORE THROAT	Sore throat, but no other symptomsgo to school BUT check the throat for spots - and check for a fever. If either is present, keep the child home and call the doctor.
RASH	Do not send a child with a rash to school until your doctor has said that it is safe to do so.
HEADACHE	Usually need not be kept home. (If you wish your child to take medication for headache, you will need to bring the medication to the office in a labeled container, with a completed Medication Administration Release Form. (see school web-site at <u>www.holyspiritschoolgr.org</u> under "Families and Students" – "Parent Forms".)
EARACHE	Consult your doctor without delay.
TOOTHACHE	Consult your dentist.
VOMITING	Please keep the child home. They may return 24 hours after their stomach has calmed. Consult your

He was three weeks early, and seemed healthy at first. Shortly after birth he began to suffer bad seizures. After many tests he was diagnosed with a rare hereditary metabolic disorder called NKH, or Glycine Encephalopathy. This is considered to be a terminal illness, as most who have it don't live to see their third birthday. At 11 years old, Josh is beating the odds. His childhood has been filled with many hospital visits for illnesses and infections that would be considered trivial to most of us. Add to that the regular visits to multiple specialists for many associated health issues, and multiple doses of several medications daily. Josh uses a wheelchair, has vision issues, has a feeding tube, is cognitively delayed at about two years old, is nonverbal (but VERY vocal), and relies on others for most of his needs. That being said, Josh is a happy boy whose blue eyes and bright smile light up a room. He loves music, playing with his brother Eric who also has NKH, seeing family and friends, and being out and about.

Josh also loves school. He is in sixth grade at Lincoln Development Center. He loves his friends, his teachers, and the ability to have more freedom than at home. Unfortunately he misses multiple days of school during the year when he has appointments, because we have no way to get Josh and his chair all the way to school from appointments. He usually rides the bus to school. Appointments usually require public transportation or insurance paid transport (which is to and from home only).

Josh lives with his mom Nancy, dad Paul, older sister Katie (13), and younger brother Eric (9). When he goes places with his family, it involves being transported in their 2006 minivan with no functioning AC, which is difficult for him because his body temperature does not regulate well. The minivan has almost 200,000 miles on it, and is unmodified. He has to be lifted up into a car seat (which he doesn't like) and then his sixty pound chair has to be lifted into the back of the van. Once he gets moving Josh is very happy, and loves to watch the world go by.

His handicap van will help with Josh's quality of life. He will get safely to appointments and therapy. He won't have to have unnecessary school absences. It will allow him to go out with his family to visit other family members, go into the community (sensory movies are a favorite!), and see more of the world outside his house. Maybe even meet with other families struggling with the same issues at an NKH Conference.

Josh has a grant from the State of Michigan, and Lori's Voice nonprofit is helping with some of the cost of transportation. However, his family needs to cover the rest of the cost. Josh is a blessing to his family, who want to help him experience the world outside his home. But as he grows, and his needs remain substantial, Josh's family needs help from the community. The family will be extremely grateful for any financial help you can provide toward the cost of a handicap van, which will enhance Josh's life considerably.
