Holy Spirit Child Development Center: Summer Care Program 2020: Enrollment Information

It is that time of year again to be thinking about summer child care. The CDC staff members are very excited for our 2020 Summer Care Program. Summer care will begin tentatively on Mon., June 8, 2020 and will tentatively end on Wed., August 12, 2020. The Summer Care Program is available for Holy Spirit School children, and pending availability, other children attending Catholic Schools within the Grand Rapids Diocese. Children must be fully enrolled at Holy Spirit, including Smart Tuition, for the 2020-21 school year. Students entering Preschool (3 years of age and toilet-trained) through 8th grade are eligible. All outstanding balances for tuition and child care expenses must be paid in full before enrollment consideration will be given.

The center hours are 7:00am until 6:00pm Monday through Friday (closed Friday, July 3 & Monday, July 6). Each day will be filled with special activities for all the children. There are also weekly destination field trip opportunities for children who will be entering 1st through 8th grade in the fall.
