Our mission at Holy Spirit School is to live, learn, and share the message and teachings of Jesus Christ.





As our weather turns "wintery" ~ please help your child/ren remember to bring boots to school for outdoor recess. Students who wear boots may play on the blacktop area...otherwise students without boots will remain on the sidewalk so that the salt, slush, etc...is not tracked onto the carpet in the classrooms. Students who are fully dressed for winter (i.e. – snow pants, boots, hats, gloves, etc.) may choose to play on the playground equipment, the upper/lower fields, and/or go sledding when offered.

ILLNESS

If a child is ill, he/she should remain at home. The Health Department suggests that a child who is well enough to be in school is well enough to participate in all school activities, including outdoor recess and physical education. If a child is ill and remains at home during the school day, the student may not attend extracurricular activities on that day (Education Commission Policy #6146.2.)

If a child becomes ill during the school day, a parent, relative, or a person designated on the child's enrollment form will be notified to come and get him/her.

What follows is a summary of the Health Department publication entitled, "When to Keep Your Child Home." The school also uses these guidelines to determine if a child should be sent home from school as well.

FEVER	Do not allow child to return to school until fever-free for hours.		
	(unassisted-without medication)		
COLD, COUGH	"Heavy cough" and hacking coughkeep home in bed even though no fever.		
SORE THROAT	Γ Sore throat, but no other symptomsgo to schoolBUT check the throat for spots –		
	and check for a fever. If either is present, keep the child home and call the doctor.		
RASH	Do not send a child with a rash to school until your doctor has said that it is safe to do so.		
HEADACHE	Usually need not be kept home. (If you wish your child to take medication for headache, you will need to bring the medication to the office in a labeled container, with a completed Medication Administration Release Form. (see school web-site at <u>www.holyspiritschoolgr.org</u> under "Families and Students" – "Parent Forms").		
EARACHE	Consult your doctor without delay.		
TOOTHACHE	Consult your dentist.		
VOMITING	Please keep the child home. They may return 24 hours after their stomach has calmed. Consult your doctor if it persists.

<u>Subscription to Gizmos</u>. Gizmos is a virtual lab program with interactive science simulations. When hands-on science learning isn't possible, this program allows the middle school students to complete virtual labs that mirror what is done in person. Given the current challenges with not sharing equipment this program is ideal in that it works well with iPads and laptops so students can work safely. While this program was free during the last school year there is now a significant cost associated with this subscription. Estimated Cost: \$875.00

Books and Classroom Supplies for Quest Program. The Quest program at Holy Spirit has a goal to foster social and emotional growth in the classroom. Quest focuses on ways to help understand and grow self-awareness. Students are put on a pursuit to be educated on issues that all students face. Quest encourages and reinforces students to listen and support each other, helping them to make the right choices. They will journey together seeking, learning, and helping themselves and classmates become strong, independent leaders at Holy Spirit and for Christ. Quest uses books to help explain concepts to students, reinforcing the main message and other messages the book gives. There is a need for new books that help with social-emotional skills for the Elementary and Jr. High students. These books will focus on self-esteem, friendship, conflict resolution and feelings among other things. Estimated Cost: \$150.00

Inspiration Station for Young 5's. The Inspiration Station easel was designed with teacher-driven features to make teaching easier and more effective while helping keep the classroom neat and tidy! Ideal for independent and group activities and with a pull-out whiteboard, there is even more space to collaborate! This Inspiration Station will be a welcome addition to the Young 5's classroom! Estimated Cost: \$535.00

<u>Manipulatives for Young 5's</u>. Magnatab letters, numbers and shapes, Block Play STEM early learning kit, Design and Build Engineering Centers Estimated Cost: \$300.00

Hands-on Religious Instruction Items for 1st grade. In first grade we are working toward adding new and engaging activities into our religion curriculum. Through songs, felt boards, and more we feel students will have an opportunity to make their understanding of our Catholic faith more meaningful to them, and help them to grow closer to God. Along with allowing more faith-filled learning opportunities in the classroom, we are also looking to add to our phonological awareness resources with hands-on games and resources. These tools will help to build strong foundational skills in phonics, which promotes strong reading skills to last a lifetime. Estimated Cost: \$495.00

<u>Classroom Library Books for Middle School.</u> Active engagement with text is one of the best ways for students to practice their comprehension skills. One of the greatest motivators for reading is choice. Having a wide selection of middle school appropriate texts is necessary to promote active engaged readers who understand and enjoy the text they are reading. Mrs. Swider is in need of more books in the classroom library in order to match high interest books to readers. This way, more students will be motivated to read on their own and practice the comprehension skills being taught during literature class. As students' interests shift and different authors become popular, it is helpful to have those high-quality books in the classroom library so that students want to read. Estimated Cost: \$300.00

<u>Garden Angels Gator Tune Up.</u> The gator was purchased by the Boosters, but the Garden Angels use it every week for 6 months out of the year and it is a critical tool for them as they beautify our grounds. Almost no maintenance has been done on the gator since it was purchased 15+ years ago and it is in need of some love. The gator needs a tune up, new tires and new seats. Estimated Cost: \$1,500.00

<u>Updated Girls Basketball Uniforms.</u> The current uniforms have been in use for several years and need to be replaced. Estimated Cost: \$2,400.00

<u>New basketballs (20 new for each grade level 5/6 & 7/8).</u> The basketballs have not been replaced in several years and are showing signs of significant wear. Estimated Cost: \$1,000.00

<u>New Volleyballs (20 new for each grade level 5/6 & 7/8)</u>. The current volleyballs have not been replaced in several years. They are not holding air and show significant wear. Estimated Cost: \$1,000.00

<u>Kindergarten Learning Tools</u>. Kindergarten standards and expectations have increased over the years, but one thing stays the same, kids love to have fun! We love to have lots of fun in the classroom while playing and learning with our friends. Please help to replace some educational materials, manipulatives, puzzles and toys that will be used to help develop our students socially, emotionally, physically, intellectually, and of course spiritually! Estimated Cost: \$675.00

Easels for Kindergarten Classroom. The art easel and learning easel are essentials in the Kindergarten classroom. The learning easel is used every day for teaching. It has served its purpose but it is well loved, falling apart and missing pieces. The art easel has also served its purpose but is over 20 years old and is fragile. A new, smaller art easel would help to make more room in the classroom as our numbers continue to grow! Estimated Cost: \$629.00

iPads for 3rd Grade. In third grade we have been working on using Google Classroom and a new program called Go Formative. This program is helpful in the classroom but also in the event that we go virtual again. As we have been working in this program we have discovered that the iPads are so outdated that some of the new programs will not work on them and they can't be updated in order to support the new programs. 3rd grade is in need of iPads that can support the programs they are using to learn both in person and virtually. Estimated Coat: \$400.00 × 25 iPads = \$10,000.00

<u>Teaching tools 2nd grade</u>. Second grade needs some updated games and puzzles for the classroom, supplemental interactive social studies activities, STEM toys to encourage logical thinking and engineering and math teaching aides. Estimated Cost: \$450.00

<u>Desks for 2nd grade</u>. The desks that the 2nd grade classroom is using are more than 20 years old. The tops are very heavy for the students ,and they have a hard time opening them and holding them up to get their supplies out. Estimated Cost: \$4,000.00

Upright piano. This new, versatile piano would be used for a variety of functions around Holy Spirit church and school. First, it would permanently replace the old upright piano that sits in the parish Multi-Purpose Room, primarily used for choir rehearsals and warming up various cantors and choir members before Mass. This piano could also be rolled into the church to be used for various church and school activities such as the school Christmas program, where we currently use a portable keyboard. Finally, this piano could easily be moved into the school gymnasium and used for Christmas and Holy Week liturgies, as needed - until our capacity in the church is able to be back to normal during this uncertain time. The gymnasium also holds other activities throughout the year where a piano could be used: Santa breakfast, school musical, annual variety show, etc. Estimated Cost: \$4,000.00

AC/Heat system for the CDC. This new system would have the ability of both heat and air conditioning, running independently of the whole school heating system. This unit would allow for heat in the CDC on chilly fall mornings when starting the entire school system is not necessary. This is also a great system to have if there are problems with the main boiler. Additionally, there are times when the CDC is open while the school is not and the opportunity to run independently from the school is necessary. Estimated Cost: \$4,000.00

New Chasuble. Estimated Cost: \$1,200.00

New Lectionary Books. Estimated Cost: \$140.00

<u>Fence for Back Playground</u>. A fence was scheduled to be put in. Unfortunately, COVID hit and we no longer had the funds to do so. Without a fence on the back playground, children can run into the parking lot and a car/truck could drive into that play area. A fence would help to keep all students who use that playground safe and keeping our kiddos safe is of the utmost importance! Estimated Cost: \$10,000.00

<u>Holy Spirit Formed.org subscription</u>. Formed.org is the Catholic Faith on demand. We use it at the parish for youth classes, sacramental prep, RCIA, seasonal programs, and evangelization. Through our parish subscription, all parishioners have free access to hundreds of movies, e-books, study programs, bible studies, and audio programs for individual or small group formation. With your help, we would like to continue to use these wonderful resources in our programming as well as providing them without charge to every parishioner. Estimated Cost: \$1,999.00

RULES

Poster must be approximately 11x17 inches in size. If pastels, chalk or charcoal are used, the poster must be laminated or covered with clear plastic. Posters may be in color or black and white.

Each poster must be submitted with a Knights of Columbus "Keep Christ in Christmas" Poster Contest entry form. The name and age of the person entering the poster should be included on the back of the poster.

All entries become the property of the Knights of Columbus Supreme Council. Posters will not be returned.

JUDGING
