WINTERY WEATHER



Just a reminder that students are outside at arrival, during recess, and at dismissal, and must be dressed appropriately for the weather. As our weather turns "wintery" ~ please help your child/ren remember to bring boots to school for outdoor recess. Students who wear boots may play on the blacktop area...otherwise students without boots will remain on the sidewalk so that the salt, slush, etc...is not tracked onto the carpet in the classrooms. Students who are fully dressed for winter (i.e. – snow pants, boots, hats, gloves, etc.) may choose to play on the playground equipment, the upper/lower fields, and/or go sledding when offered. Let's work together to keep all students healthy and warm!

ILLNESS

If a child is ill, he/she should remain at home. The Health Department suggests that a child who is well enough to be in school is well enough to participate in all school activities, including outdoor recess and physical education. If a child is ill and remains at home during the school day, the student may not attend extra-curricular activities on that day (Education Commission Policy #6146.2.)

If a child becomes ill during the school day, a parent, relative, or a person designated on the child's enrollment form will be notified to come and get him/her.

What follows is a summary of the Health Department publication entitled, "When to Keep Your Child Home." The school also uses these guidelines to determine if a child should be sent home from school as well.

FEVER Do not allow child to return to school until fever-free for 24 hours.

(unassisted-without medication)

COLD, COUGH "Heavy cough" and hacking cough...keep home in bed even though no fever.

SORE THROAT Sore throat, but no other symptoms...go to school...BUT check the throat for spots

and check for a fever. If either is present, keep the child home and call the doctor.

RASH **Do not send a child with a rash** to school until your doctor has said that it is safe

to do so.

HEADACHE Usually need not be kept home. (If you wish your child to take medication for

headache, you will need to bring the medication to the office in a labeled container, with a completed Medication Administration Release Form. (see school web-site at www.holyspiritschoolgr.org under "Parent Information" – "Forms & Registration

Info").

EARACHE Consult your doctor without delay.

TOOTHACHE Consult your dentist.

VOMITING Please keep the child home. They may return 24 hours after their stomach has

calmed. Consult your doctor if it persists.

Spanish Class News at Holy Spirit – November 2022

<u>Kindergarten</u>- We are currently learning the color words! The children have been introduced to rojo (red), azul (blue), amarillo (yellow), naranja or anaranjado (orange), verde (green) and rosado or rosa (pink). We respond to the following commands: come (eat), baila (dance), corre (run), salta (jump), mira (look). See how much your child can produce and/or respond to!

<u>First grade</u>- Our 2nd unit is all about pizza! The children are learning a song called, "Soy una pizza" (I am a pizza). We just finished all the verses and soon you will see the lyrics come home, along with a "pizza" we will create during class!

<u>Second-Third grades</u>- We have been learning foods that we may eat in the Fall and how to say "I like to eat (Me gusta comer) and I don't like to eat (No me gusta comer). We've been practicing the song "I like to eat apples and bananas" in Spanish: see if your child will sing it to you! We recently learned vocabulary and a song for El Dia de Muertos (Day of the Dead) which was on November 1-2. Comidas: la manzana (apple), el pan (bread), el pavo (turkey), el puree de papas (mashed potatoes), la tarta de calabaza (pumpkin pie), los frijoles (beans).

<u>Fourth grade-</u> We recently learned/reviewed the days of the week in Spanish. Students also learned vocabulary and a song related to the holiday El Dia de Muertos. Next month, students will be singing some carols in Spanish around school: we will be learning El Burrito Sabanero (The little donkey of the savannah), Noche de Paz (Silent Night) and Feliz Navidad.

<u>Fifth-Eighth grades</u>- We are starting to wrap up Unit 2: 8th graders are currently taking the final quiz for the unit. Students have learned the song <u>Corre Corre Corazon</u> by Agapornis, learned corre (he/she runs), camina (he/she walks) and ve (he/she sees), learned about La Carrera de San Silvestre (The St. Silvester Race) and El Encierro de San Fermin (Running of the Bulls in Pamplona, Spain). Ask your student about what they learned of these events! 6th-7th graders will be finishing up the unit this week.

The week of Thanksgiving, Sofia (our exchange student from Spain) will be visiting and will interact with grades K-5 on Tuesday. I hope to have her see the middle school students right before Christmas break or in the Spring!

RULES
