SEVERE WEATHER, CANCELLATIONS & BUSSING INFORMATION

In the event that it is necessary to delay the start of school or cancel classes, Holy Spirit School will communicate with you through Grand Rapids area radio and television stations. You may also access school closing announcements thru the following Web Sites: www.woodtv.com or www.wzzm13.com.

Every effort will be made to make one of the following announcements by 6:00 a.m. or as soon as possible thereafter...

Situation/Condition	Response/Policy
If the announcement is Holy Spirit School is closed:	Students do not report for school that day. This always includes Preschool and Child Care Programs as well.
If the Public School District you reside in is closed in your area: Catholic Schools have a two-hour delay:	No Catholic Schools Transportation in the A.M. or P.M. into the closed Public School District areas. Catholic Schools Transportation will begin transporting two hours after regular time. There will be no AM Preschool or Y5's or AM Kindergarten. Child Care will open at regular time for those enrolled in the program.
If the Public School District you reside in has a two-hour delay and Catholic Schools are on a regular schedule:	No Catholic Schools Transportation into the delayed district for the A.M. ONLY.

If school is closed because of inclement weather, all extra-curricular activities, including athletic events and practices, scheduled for Holy Spirit or for Holy Spirit teams on that day, will be cancelled. (Education Commission policy #2060.1)

On those winter days when school is open but you feel weather conditions are unsafe for your child to go to school, you may keep him or her home. However, we ask that you call school and let us know that you are keeping your child at home. While we do urge you to call school when your child will be absent, please don't call the school to ask if classes will be cancelled because of the weather. Instead, we urge you to monitor Grand Rapids area radio and television stations, or their web sites, which will be informed immediately of any cancellations or delays.

Spanish Class News at Holy Spirit – October 2023

Kindergarten-The children continue to learn Fall vocabulary through songs and games. They have also been learning the colors amarillo (yellow), naranja (orange) and marrón (brown). We are learning a song about El Otoño (the Fall). See if your child can tell you some fall vocabulary/colors in Spanish!

First- Children are also learning Fall vocabulary and song and reviewing their colors in Spanish. We are also starting to learn about the holiday El Dia de los Muertos (Day of the Dead). Ask your child about what we've been doing and learning during Spanish class!

Second- In Second grade, we are learning Fall vocabulary, reviewing colors, learning basic weather phrases, and also learning about Dia de los Muertos (Day of the Dead). We are learning a song that helps us learn about this holiday celebrated on Nov. 1-2.

Third/Fourth- Students have been learning the Spanish Alphabet and have a good grasp on listening to and spelling words/reading words in Spanish. We've learned a few songs (ask them about the vowels song in Spanish!) and are reviewing the holiday Dia de los Muertos as well with the song they learned last year on the site rockalingua.com

Fifth- Students have finished the first unit in the curriculum SOMOS. They recently took a pre-assessment from unit 2 in which I will document growth from them and have them take it again around January when we finish the 2nd unit to see how they have progressed in their Spanish skills! A short unit is next in which students will use/understand vocabulary about expressing likes and dislikes in Spanish (me gusta, te gusta, le gusta).

Sixth- We are currently working through Unit 3 in SOMOS. Students are progressing with the targeted vocabulary of son las (it is _____ o clock), abre la puerta (he/she opens the door), nunca cierra (he/she never closes). Students recently wrote a short story using learned vocabulary and will next be learning about the Panama Canal in the target language.

Seventh and Eighth (First hour class)- Students are close to finishing Unit 4 in SOMOS. We are continuing to learn the following core vocabulary: toma (he/she takes), quiere ser (he/she wants to be), habla (he/she speaks) plus recognizing vocabulary related to school classes and professions.

Eighth (Fourth hour class)- Students recently learned the rules for conjugating -ar verbs and practiced conjugating in context of a story. They took a reading assessment for Unit 4 and are now starting Unit 5 with the cultural theme of bullfighting in Mexico and Spain.
