Spanish Class News at Holy Spirit: February 2024

<u>Kindergarten</u>- We have been learning some winter clothing in Spanish such as gorro-winter hat, bufanda-scarf, guantes-gloves, pantalones-pants and botas-boots. We continue to practice colors, numbers through the calendar and the song, "Invierno" which means winter.

<u>First</u>- Students are doing well with being able to say some winter vocabulary (see kindergarten news above). See if they can sing to you the clothing song and Invierno song that we've been doing. We've also been reviewing numbers up to 20 and days of the week.

<u>Second</u>- Students continue to work on/learn winter vocabulary by identifying activities they do in the winter, identifying their favorite by writing and drawing it and identifying clothing they wear in the winter. We've also been reviewing color vocabulary in this theme.

<u>Third</u>- We continue to listen to and spell in Spanish using winter vocabulary. We started our song about a girl and her cat and will continue in March. We are also practicing vocabulary online using the site <u>rocalingua.com</u>. Students know how to access it: it's a great place to reinforce what they are learning with me in Spanish class.

<u>Fourth</u>- Fourth graders continue to learn about Srta. Amarilla and Sr. Azul in the adventures they have together. We are about halfway through the "songs-stories" as there are 6 episodes!

<u>Fifth</u>- Thank you so much for your donations! Students really enjoyed their fiesta and there was a ton of food/drinks for all! We are currently learning the Spanish speaking countries; ask your child to tell you how many there are and what they are learning about them. In March, students will do a brief report on one country-in Spanish!

<u>Sixth</u>- Lately, students have been helping to create a story in Spanish using our vocabulary for Unit 4. Students have been responding to statements in Spanish using the yo form (I) of the verbs we are practicing.

<u>Seventh/Eighth</u>- Students are working through Unit 5 vocabulary. We are learning the vocabulary through stories and online practice. I've introduced a site called Quizlet in which they can practice the vocabulary in a variety of different formats outside of class. If students are absent or need extra practice, this site is where they should go.

4th hour Spanish 8 Students are halfway through Unit 7. Soon, they will be learning about the Castells of Tarragona (human towers). My goal is to get through Unit 10 with them before the end of the school year so they can take the placement test and hopefully test out of Spanish 1. We are on track so far!
