<u>Sports Fees for 2024-25</u> - For several years, the sports fee has been \$85 per child, per year. For the 2023-24 school year, just to cover our league/team fees and expenses (no new uniforms or equipment), we would have had to charge each child \$188. Even with our Athletic Boosters offsetting a significant portion of the difference, this fee structure is no longer sustainable. **Our School Board of Directors has approved a fee increase to \$125 per child, per year.** This is still a significant discount from the true cost of athletic participation as we want to make it as affordable as possible for students to participate.

The Cost per physical will be \$20.00 per student. Please make checks payable to HS Athletics, and attach it to the Physical forms.

Spanish Class News at Holy Spirit: April 2024

<u>Kindergarten</u>- We have been learning a song and vocabulary related to Spring (la primavera). We are getting better with identifying colors and more vocabulary in Spanish.

<u>First</u>- In First grade, we've been learning phrases to use when we like a food (me gusta), don't like a food (no me gusta), what to say when a food is disgusting (Que asco!) and when we love a food (me encanta). You should see some papers coming home in the next week or two as to what we've been learning/doing as well.

<u>Second-</u> We are now just starting to learn the 2nd episode of Chispa which is, "Chispa quiere pintar" Chispa wants to paint. We will be reviewing colors and learning new vocabulary through this episode.

<u>Third</u>- Third graders are learning the numbers up to 1,000. I've been focusing mainly up to 100, yet in our song, numbers go by hunderds up to un mil. We've been doing different activities and games to practice these. As of late, we've been playing Bingo with these numbers and we review them when we guess the current temperature in Spanish!

<u>Fourth-</u> We've been acting out scenarios of doctor/patient using vocabulary in our "Me duele" unit. Can your child tell you some phrases as to what body part hurts him/her? We've been learning a song in Rockalingua that helps us to remember these phrases.

<u>Fifth</u>- We are in Unit 2.5 learning the core vocabulary of puede, no puede, va and hay. Does your child know what these phrases mean? We created a class story, acted it out and recently heard the story of Ellie and her stick horse in Spanish.

<u>Sixth</u>- Sixth graders recently took a quiz over Unit 4. Grades can be seen for 4th quarter in Infinite Campus. We are just starting Unit 5 with the new vocabulary of: su hermano va a (his/her brother goes to), tiene una novia (he/she has a girlfriend), esta enojado (is angry). Please contact me if you would like to know about how your child can practice current vocabulary at home.

<u>Seventh/Eighth</u>- Students recently took a quiz over Unit 5. Eighth graders will be reviewing topics over the next few weeks that I haven't covered with them this or last year. Seventh grade will start Unit 6 soon.

<u>4th hour Spanish 8 students</u> – We are halfway through Unit 8 and learning about latin-inspired foods. Students will continue to learn vocabulary through context and learn about some new foods they maybe haven't heard of before. We may have a taste test of some foods/drinks. Please contact

me if you would be interested in helping and/or making something for this.
